

for Red Nose Day. We raised just over £450.00 in total. Monies raised will now be used to transform lives across the UK and some of the world's poorest countries.







No interest loans in Leominster

A local charity 'Tenbury Nils Scheme' is able to provide interest free loans of up to £400.00 to people in financial need living within a 15 mile radius of Tenbury Wells, this no interest loan can be repaid over 12 or 24 months. Whilst not providing a cash loan, Tenbury Nils deals directly with suppliers of household appliances such as cookers, washing machines and fridges. They can also help with school uniforms, college bus passes and medical appliances as well as other necessary items. There is now an office located in Leominster Library, they are open on a Tuesday between 10am—2pm and from June will also be open on a Thursday.
