Tropical Inc Visit LPS

Year 4 at Leominster Primary School became a tropical rainforest for the day on Thursday 21st September. Stephen Rowlands of Tropical Inc arrived with his assortment of animals and gave the children a talk all about rainforests. Stephen has always had an interest in animals and as a child growing up Wales shared his home with snakes and tarantulas! As well as being able to get up close to the animals the children then had a chance to stroke or hold the animals which proved very popular. A thoroughly informative and session which both the children and staff enjoyed.



Popcorn Brownies—Why not have a go at making these popcorn brownies? Always get an adult to help you.

You will need the following:- 100g of sweet popcorn, 80g of self-raising flour, 300g of icing sugar, 40g of cocoa powder, 300g of dark chocolate, 180g of unsalted butter, 4 tsp golden syrup, 1 tsp vanilla extract, 4 eggs, 300g of white chocolate buttons.



To make the brownies:-

1. Preheat the oven to 180C/Gas mark 4. Line a baking tin with parchment paper.
2. Sift the flour, icing sugar and cocoa powder into a bowl and set aside.
3. Add the dark chocolate, butter and golden syrup to a pan and place over a low heat. Heat until the chocolate melts, then add the vanilla extract and stir to combine.
4. Carefully crack the eggs into a bowl and whisk until pale and fluffy.
5. Slowly fold the warm melted chocolate mixture into the eggs, then gently fold in the flour mixture until fully incorporated.
6. Add the white chocolate and 50g of the popcorn. Pour the mixture into the lined baking tin and bake in the oven for 30 minutes.
7. Remove the tray from the oven and allow to cool. Once the brownie is cool enough to handle, remove from the

Operation Christmas Child

In previous years we have participated in Operation Christmas Child, a charity that distributes shoeboxes filled with gifts for needy children around the world. This year we would like to invite each class to participate in filling a shoe box and ask each child in the class to bring in a gift for the box, please see below for ideas:-

- Toys—Include items such as dolls, stuffed toys (with CE label), toy trucks, harmonica, yo-yo, skipping rope, ball, small puzzles etc.
- School supplies—Pens, pencils, sharpeners, crayons, felt pens, stamp & ink pad sets, notebooks & paper, solar calculators, colouring and picture books etc.
- Hygiene Items—Toothbrush, toothpaste, wrapped soap, comb or hairbrush, flannel.
- Other items—Hat, cap, gloves, scarf, sunglasses, hair accessories, jewellery set, wind up torch, wrapped sweets.
- Please do not include—damaged items, war related items, chocolate or other food items, liquids or lotions, medicines, sharp objects, mirrors or glass containers.

If your child wants to bring in a filled shoebox of their own this is not a problem. We hope that we are able to fill at least one shoebox per class. Please ensure items are brought into school by Friday 10th November.
