Assessment in Year 2

- Expectations in Year 2 are higher.
- Children are assessed against a series of 'agerelated' expectations, and judgements will be made against these.
- Judgements in Year 2 are based on teacher assessment and supported by testing.

Assessment in Year 2

The three judgements awarded to the children are:

- 'Working at the expected standard' the child is working at national standards and has made 'expected' progress for a Year 2 child.
- 'Working at greater depth within the expected standard' the child has exceeded the national standards and achieved more than the expected progress for a Year 2 child.
- 'Working towards the expected standard' the child is not working at the national standards but is working towards it.
- Children will also be given a 'scaled score' based on the outcomes of the test to be judged as 'expected' the children need to achieve a score of 100.

The tests

Children will sit tests in: Reading (2 papers) Mathematics (2 papers) Spelling and Grammar and Punctuation

The tests will take place in May 2019. Children work in small groups of approximately half the class at a time.



Reading

The Reading Test consists of two separate papers:

- Paper 1 Contains a selection of texts totalling between 400 and 700 words with questions about the text. This paper includes a list of useful words and some practice questions for teachers to use to introduce the question types.
- Paper 2 Contains a reading booklet of a selection of passages totalling 800 to 1100 words. Children will write their answers to questions about the passage in a separate booklet. There are no practice questions in this booklet.
- Each paper should take approximately 30-40 minutes to complete but it is not strictly timed.
- The texts will cover a range of poetry, fiction and non-fiction.



Questions are designed to assess the comprehension and understanding of a child's reading.

Mathematics

Children will sit two tests: Paper 1 and Paper 2:

- Paper 1 is for arithmetic, lasting approximately 25 minutes. It covers calculation methods for all operations.
- Paper 2 covers problem solving, reasoning and mathematical fluency, lasts for approximately 35 minutes.
- Pupils will still require calculation skills and questions will be varied including multiple choice, matching, true/false, completing a chart or table or drawing a shape. Some questions will also require children to show or explain their working out.
