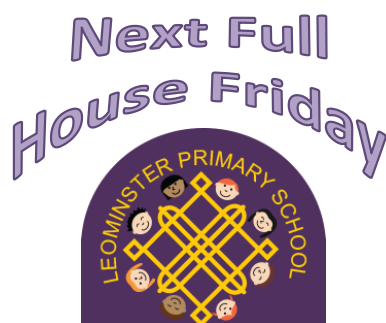

**Full House Friday: Girls vs. Boys!**

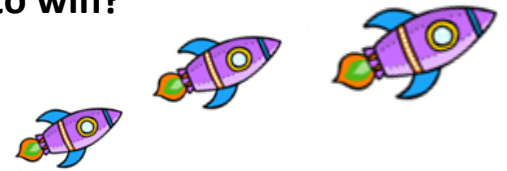
Are the Girls great or are the Boys brilliant?

### Holidays in Term Time

Many of you will have seen media reports regarding a recent Supreme Court ruling about term time absence. **This has clarified the situation and confirmed that schools have authority to refuse to authorise absence for holidays. This is based on the fact that there are thirteen weeks available to parents for holidays which would not impact on their child's education.**

The Government guidelines and school policy regarding term time holidays is clear. It is policy not to authorise any absence for term time holidays. If a family is aware of the need for a future absence from school they should write to the Head Teacher explaining the need for the absence, giving as much detail as possible. The Head Teacher will give the matter full consideration and he has the authority to authorise up to 10 days absence in exceptional circumstances. A holiday does not reach the criteria of exceptional circumstances.

If a family does take a term time holiday they will be referred to the Herefordshire Council Legal Department who will make the decision as to what action will be taken. This action can include fines and even court action and will take into account previous attendance and previous holiday absence.

This policy is based on sound statistical information that any absence from school is detrimental to a child's education and the school has a duty to do everything it can to ensure that all children receive the best possible start in life.
