Safeguarding

It has come to our attention that many children throughout the school are using snapchat on devices at home. We would like to advise that Snapchat's use regulations say that a person must be 13 to use it.

Also, please be aware of a potentially dangerous feature called 'Snap Map'. If the location services within Snapchat are not turned off, then the user's exact location will be made public to other users. This is a most concerning feature.

We advise that all our children do not use Snapchat. However, if you are consistently supervising their use and have explained all dangers associated with Snapchat, please could you ensure that the location feature is switched off.

Year 6 trip to artwork


On Friday 12th January, a group of year six pupils went to view an art installation in The Priory Church made by Jackie H Morris. The artwork was inspired by a bell ringing tune called Stedman Doubles. She used the pattern of the bells to create a ring of prints hanging from the roof of The Priory. Altogether, there were three hundred screen prints, all in rows of five. Each print represents a bell in a tune. It is basically a sheet of music but in a circle. The artist is doing a Master's Degree at Swansea University, after getting a first class degree in fine art at Hereford College of Arts. A man met us at The Priory to explain what the artwork was about. He played the music that it was based on and told us the tune was in a circle. Some children said,

"It was great fun to see the installation, learn about how it was made and even look inside."

"I thought that it was amazing and I loved the pattern of the screen prints"

"It was really fun and I was amazed by the artwork and how it was linked to music and music notes."
