Bonfire Cupcake Bake-Off

Have fun making these delicious Bonfire Cupcakes on 5th November. They are delicious! Don't forget to ask an adult to help you. You will need the following ingredients:-

For the cupcakes

- 150g unsalted butter, softened
- 150g caster sugar
- 175g self-raising flour
- 1tsp baking powder
- 25g cocoa powder
- 3 large eggs
- 1 tbsp. milk
- Grated zest from one orange

For the buttercream:

- 110g unsalted butter, softened
- 440g icing sugar
- 2 tbsp. freshly squeezed orange juice
- Red and orange food colouring

You will also need:

- 1 box of chocolate orange Matchmakers
- 1. Preheat oven to 180 C/350 F/Gas Mark 4. Place 12 muffin sized paper cases in you muffin tin.
- 2. All the cupcake ingredients go into one mixing bowl, then give them a good mix.
- 3. Spoon this mixture into your muffin cases, fill each case half full.
- Get your oven gloves and carefully put your muffin tin into the pre-heated oven, leave to cook for approximately 20–25 minutes. While the cakes are cooking make the buttercream.
- 5. Place the softened butter into a bowl and whisk it.
- Carefully weigh the icing sugar into another bowl and then sift the icing sugar into the butter (about 2 tbsps.) Whisk the icing sugar into the butter, carry on adding the icing sugar in stages and whisk after each addition.
 Once all the icing sugar has been added to the
 - Once all the icing sugar has been added to the butter, slowly pour in the orange juice to bring the buttercream together. Leave it to one side.
- 8. Remove the cupcakes from the oven and leave them to cool on a wire rack.
- Now for the buttercream piping! Add the buttercream to your piping bag and add the food colouring, you can alternate with one red and one orange. Pipe this onto your cupcakes.
 Carefully break your matchmakers in half and place around the flame.
- 11. Then enjoy bonfire night whilst you tuck into your delicious cupcakes!
