Dear Parents/Carers,

Year 1 visit to Leominster museum – Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> October

In our topic sessions this term we have been learning about ‘What it was like 150 years ago’ focusing on Victorian times and toys from the past.

In order to further enhance the children’s learning in this area, we have planned a visit to Leominster museum where the children will be able to learn about what it was like to be a child during this time. They will also have the opportunity to play with some toys from the past and also learn some Victorian games. We will be visiting the museum on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> October.

Children will need to wear a waterproof, warm coat, their school uniform and sensible shoes. If your child requires an inhaler please ensure it is in school and in date. We will not be able to take your child on the trip if they are asthmatic and do not have an in date inhaler.

The school has very high expectations of children's behaviour whilst they are representing Leominster Primary School. Therefore, we need to be confident that all children’s behaviour is excellent and they conduct themselves in a sensible manner at all times. Year 1 Victorian Day – Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> October

Following the trip to the museum, we will be holding a ‘Victorian day’ in school on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> October. As part of this day, the children will be playing Victorian games, making Victorian food and learning to write on blackboards! They will experience a true Victorian school day.

We hope that this will be a fun day for the children and help to bring their learning to life! We would really like the children to come dressed in Victorian costumes.

Clothing suggestions:

For boys – Dark trousers tucked into long dark socks  
Collarless shirt (possibly cut off the collar from an old shirt)  
Black or brown lace-up boots or shoes – no trainers

For girls – Long sleeved high-necked white blouse  
Dark knee-length skirt – not full length (no trousers)  
Dark tights or long socks  
Black or brown lace-up boots or shoes – no trainers  
Hair in plaits or kept off the face with a hairband  
No mop caps – these were worn only by servants

We look forward to a great ‘Victorian’ experience.
