Year 6 will be sitting their SATs the week beginning Monday 12th May.

The timetable is as follows:

Monday 12th May – Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar Papers 1 and 2

Tuesday 13th May – Reading

Wednesday 14th May – Maths Paper 1 (arithmetic) and 2 (reasoning)

Thursday 15th May – Maths Paper 3 (reasoning)

During SATs week:

- ·Please make sure that your child goes to bed (sleep) at a reasonable time.
- Restrict their time on electrical devices to ensure they are as 'refreshed' as possible each day.
- ·Get up early so that children don't feel 'rushed' when they come to school.
- ·From Monday to Thursday, join the LPS teachers for breakfast (free of charge) where the children can feel relaxed and prepare for the day ahead. Children can arrive at school from 8.30am and breakfast will be held in the school hall. Breakfast will include toast and fruit juice.

English

This term, Years 5 and 6 will be focusing on the narrative writing and letter writing. Some of our pieces will also link to the Vicious Vikings!

French

Our two units of work are titled 'A l'ecole' (At School) and 'Le week-end' (The Weekend). Children will work on saying, recognising and spelling new vocabulary and develop their sentence building in French.

Science

Our science topic for the first half term is **'Evolution and Inheritance'**. Within this topic, the children will recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago. They will also recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents and they will identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution.

In the second half term, our topic is 'Living things and their habitats'. Within this topic, the children will describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences, including micro-organisms, plants and animals. They will also give reasons for classifying plants and animals based on specific characteristics.

Maths

In mathematics this term, we will be following the objectives outlined in the National Curriculum. Our main foci for this term will be Shape, Problem Solving and Investigations.

Year 5 and 6 Summer Curriculum

Music

We will be continuing with our 'Charanga' scheme of work, and this term will be focusing on 'rap music' around the popular 'Fresh Prince of Bel Air' theme song.

R

In RE, we'll continue our study of Christian beliefs by considering the question 'Creation & Science – Conflict or Complimentary?'. In the second half of the term, we will explore 'How does faith help people when life gets hard?'

opic

Our topic for this term is 'Vicious Vikings! True or False?'. In this topic, we will look at the Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor. This includes the Viking raids and invasion, the resistance by Alfred the Great and Athelstan, the first king of England, further Viking invasions and Danegeld and Anglo-Saxon laws and justice.

Computing

In computing, we will be building on previous experiences of coding. Year 5 will be controlling traffic lights and designing a range of games. Year 6 will be creating a game with a timer and

Art and DT

In DT, we will explore the design and construction of playground structures. We will develop an understanding of how different materials and techniques are used to create strong and safe structures. We will then design and build our own playground models.

In art, we will be looking at 'What is street art?'. Children will learn about street artists, such as Banksy, and learn how to use the environment to create artwork.

PSHE

Our PSHE topic this term is 'Anti-Social

Behaviour'. We will be exploring how to be responsible members of society through learning about rules, laws, crimes and community. In the second half term, we will be discussing E-Safety and the use of social media.
